In 2018, the missions of the National Centre for the Development of Sport (CNDS) are taking on a new focus.

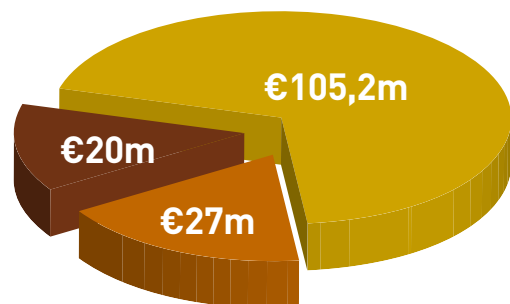


The missions receiving direct support from the Ministry of Sport as of 2018 are:

- Organisation of Major International Sporting Events
- Support for France's National Olympic and Paralympic Committees (CNOSF and CPSF)
- Key national infrastructure

For supporting the development of community sports practice: **€105,2m**

For supporting community sports facilities: **€27m**

For rolling out the Legacy & Society Plan: **€20m**

For raising the media profile of emerging sports or those with little media coverage: **€1m**

Major International Sporting Events commitments as at 31/12/2017: **€4,6m**

By devoting 50% of operating appropriations to the most vulnerable local areas

By contributing to the target of 3 million more people doing sport.

WHAT ARE ITS AIMS?

Support the development of sport among people of all ages, from all walks of life: in terms of local area

Four exclusive aims:

- support jobs in sport (5,070 CNDS jobs, 6,000 apprentices)
- correct inequalities of access to sport (particularly among women, disabled people and socially disadvantaged groups)
- promote the health benefits of sport
- combat discrimination, violence and harassment in sport

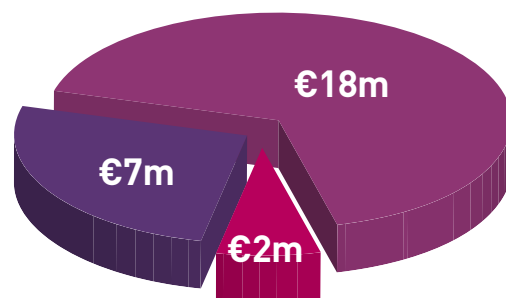

Give precedence to deprived local areas and to innovative projects in terms of facilities

Two aims:

- Reduce territorial inequalities by giving priority to projects in the 1,500 urban policy priority neighbourhoods and rural areas
- Encourage innovative projects, via new facilities in terms of architectural or functional design, practice and use

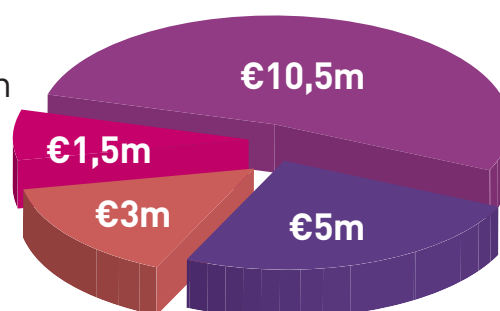
50 priority neighbourhoods identified among the 375 neighbourhoods in mainland France facing a combination of hurdles (no sports facilities and the lowest rates of facilities per 10,000 residents)

Encourage social innovation through sport: the Legacy & Society Plan

Two aims:

- tap into the momentum sparked by the organisation of the 2024 Paris Games so as to help sports organisations to change for the better and contribute to the target of 3 million more people doing sport
- support projects fostering social innovation by becoming a social and environmental responsibility centre that calls on private partners and sponsors.

Pie chart: €20m including
€10,5m for supporting social innovation projects through sport,
€5m for the construction of freely accessible community sports facilities,
€3m for the *Fête du Sport* (Sports Festival) announced by the Minister Laura Flessel post-Lima and **€1,5m** for the “*J’apprends à nager*” initiative (which provides free swimming lessons for 6-12 years olds in deprived urban neighbourhoods and rural areas)



Maintenance of the support fund for audiovisual projects helping to raise the media profile of sports receiving little media coverage, by extending it to the fight against discrimination in sport
